FULBRIGHT PROGRAM FOR U.S. STUDENTS

Hampshire College Applicant Instructions

2017-2018 Competition; Apply in Summer/Fall 2016

The 2017-2018 Fulbright U.S. Student Program competition opens in the spring of 2016, for grants beginning in late summer/fall 2017.

Nomination by Hampshire College is required for current students. Alumni who wish to work with the Fulbright Program Advisors and receive an evaluation by the Campus Committee **must** apply through Hampshire, with an EARLIER application deadline than the national deadline. It's worth noting that applicants who go through the campus process are generally more successful, so we encourage you to do so.

- It is your responsibility to ensure that all portions of the application, including letters of affiliation and recommendations, are received by the appropriate deadline. (See below.)
- After the August deadline, you will be assigned a Hampshire Fulbright Mentor, who will offer additional guidance and feedback on your application materials.
- As you're requesting transcripts or letters of recommendation and/or affiliation from outside the College (particularly from outside the U.S.), please do so early. It often takes weeks and months to set up affiliations, and we suggest you allow people a month to write a letter in support of you. Allow two weeks for your Hampshire transcript.

- Fulbright-National Geographic Digital Storytelling Fellowship
