The Application process

We've collected and analyzed the stories of our successful students and defined common traits that we look for across the application process. It's holistic and personalized to our campus community. Hampshire students are self-motivated, disciplined, highly empathetic, and have a capacity to reflect on their work. Are you the perfect candidate?

A note on standardized testing: Hampshire is a test-blind college, meaning we do not accept SAT and ACT scores in our admissions practice or consider them at all. Our institutional research shows that SAT/ACT scores do not correlate to student success here, and national research indicates inherent social, economic, and racial biases in these tests.
