The main TRU campus is in Kamloops, a city of over 80,000 at the centre of the southern interior of the province of British Columbia. The city is approximately four hours drive north-east of Vancouver and is serviced by multiple daily flights to and from Vancouver and Calgary.</p> <p>Superb summers, four dramatic seasons, sports and outdoor recreation, including world class down hill skiing, and a diversity of cultural activities that few small cities can match are among the attractions. Students are within minutes from spectacular natural landscapes with the chance for hiking, fishing, biking among many outdoor activities. Banff and Jasper National Parks are less than a day's drive away.</p>

Facilities include the Ecological Research Institute, Karelian Institute, focusing on the humanities and social sciences; the Mekrijärvi Research Station at Ilomantsi for advanced study in hydrobiology and forestry; the Botanical Garden; and the Muikko Research Vessel, which specializes in environmental studies in inland waters. Joensuu, located on Lake Pyhaselka, is a North Karelian city in the heart of the eastern Finnish lake country and is the economic and cultural center of the region. Joensuu offers a variety of winter sports, including skiing, skating, and ice-dipping.</p>

Its students make up a quarter of all university students in the country. The main university area is located in the beautiful neo-classical center of Helsinki, the capital of Finland since 1812. With the transfer of the university from Turku to Helsinki in 1828, the new capital soon grew into the cultural center of the country. With its large population, Helsinki is able to sustain a rich variety of cultural activities. There is an abundance of restaurants, bars, theaters, museums, and sporting events.</p>

It is made up of two locations split by the Manawatu River: Turitea across the river from the city and Hokowhitu on the city-side.</p> <p>One-third of the people living in Palmerston North are between the ages of fifteen and thirty. Many are students, making Palmerston North a young person's city with a lively social scene. The city center is vibrant with its many cafes, pubs, live theatre and live music. Sport and off-campus adventure are also part of the city's attraction. Minutes from campus are some of the best mountain bike tracks anywhere. Further a field you will find bungy jumping, river kayaking, rafting, trout fishing, horseback riding and tramping. It's only a two hours' drive to the capital city of Wellington, to vineyards and beaches in Hawke's Bay, or to snow covered ski slopes at Mount Ruapehu in wintertime.</p>

Stellenbosch is 12 miles from beautiful beaches and 34 miles from Cape Town. The active nature-lover can enjoy the hiking trails in the surrounding mountain ranges or even a walk in the town's nature reserve.</p> <p>Stellenbosch also offers a wide variety of cultural activities in which the university's departments of Music, Drama and Creative Arts play an important role. The Stellenbosch wine region is one of the oldest in the southern hemisphere and certainly regarded as the most beautiful. A student at the Department of Forest and Wood Science will also partake in social events and practical work in the field. Apart from the sport, culture and social activities presented by the broader campus, the Forest Science department has its own exciting social schedule.</p>

The region is also known for its high tech industry, pulp and paper manufacturing, and home of the furniture manufacturer, IKEA. The surrounding pristine lakes and forests are an attraction for those who love wildlife and the outdoors. Vaxjo is also one of the leading tennis cities in the world as Mats Wilander, Stefan Edberg, Magnus Larsson and Jonas Bjorkman have all trained and played here.
