A close contact tests positive Someone with whom you spent more than 15 minutes within 6 feet, without a mask, starting 2 days before illness onset or, for asymptomatic cases, 2 days prior to specimen collection.	No, you should self-quarantine and follow CDC guidelines. Work from home and do not go into public spaces for at least 14 days.	Yes, household or other close contacts should be tested for COVID-19, even with no symptoms.	Call your immediate supervisor and email Human Resources.	Your healthcare provider will manage your health needs. Continue to self-monitor your health daily. Public health officials will advise you about return to work timing.
Coworker, friend or casual contact tests positive: Someone you were not within 6 feet of for more than 15 minutes, without a mask.	Yes, you can work on campus as long as you do not have any symptoms and you were not a close contact (see above).	Maybe. You are not considered a close contact, but could choose to be tested.	No notification needed.	If you have no symptoms, you do not need healthcare. Continue to self-monitor your health daily.
<u>Friend of a friend tests positive</u> . You were in contact with your friend but not the person who tested positive.	Yes, you can work as long as you do not have any symptoms.	Not unless you have symptoms.	No notification needed.	If you have no symptoms, you do not need healthcare. Continue to self-monitor your health daily.
